Chilli

Red Hot & Spicy! For all your cooking & marinade needs! Grow your own chilli plant easily from seed or seedlings. Easy to grow and maintain Chilli bushes are a staple in many home gardens and grow great in pots as well.

Chillies grow particularly well in warm climates all year round with continual harvesting. The fruit follow on from white flowers and come in a variety of shapes and sizes once matured.
